#### SUPPORTING YOUR PARISH

#### AND DIOCESE FINANCIALLY

Until the Covid-19 pandemic, parishes met their budgetary needs thanks to the generosity of successive generations of Catholics.

People have made it possible for parishes to meet all their bills and priests have been supported also with offerings from the people.

But a lot has changed.

The Covid-19 Pandemic led to the closure of churches throughout the Diocese of Cork and Ross for a considerable period of time. As a result, people were unable to contribute to the upkeep of their parish faith community through the weekly Offertory Collection. This meant a substantial reduction in income for parishes.

People can now support their local parish and provide an income for their priest(s) by using one or more of these established and some new methods:

- Contributing to the collections taken up at Mass
- Returning envelopes for clergy offerings or Station Dues
- 3. Using the parish's new online Donate facility
- 4. Setting up a Standing Order on a bank account

This leaflet explains methods 3 and 4.

But, first, what's the money for?

### 1. The Weekly Offertory Collection

The Offertory Collection helps the parish pay its week-to-week bills. These include online communications, lighting, parish IT, heating, insurance, wages of parish office employees, ongoing repairs, upkeep and maintenance of churches, the purchase of necessary supplies.

#### 2. The Priests' Income Collections

(Spring, Autumn, Christmas Day and Easter Sunday)

The Offertory Collection does not provide an income for priests. The income of priests is from separate offerings made by the faithful.

The quarterly Priests' Income Collection helps priests meet their living and ministry expenses (utilities, motor costs, food, study, healthcare, equipment, etc).

#### 3. Annual Diocesan Collections

These collections are taken up during the year as a second collection in church, usually one per month. They help fund the Diocesan Offices and services which provide support and advice to parishes in areas such as schools and education, safeguarding, GDPR, Garda vetting, pastoral development and training, professional, legal and accounting services.

They also support local, national and universal Catholic charitable causes, e.g. Mission Sunday, the Holy Places in Jerusalem, Marriage Care, Papal Charities.

#### NEW WAYS TO HELP

#### **DONATE Online**

Online transactions are an integral part of our daily lives using a credit card or a debit card.

The diocese and our parishes have engaged a professional service to manage all our online donations.

A Donate button has been added to our parish website. (When a parish doesn't yet have its own website, donations for the parish can be made through the website of the diocese.)

It is a safe, confidential and convenient online method for making a once-off or recurring donation to your parish or the diocese or your local clergy.

#### STANDING ORDERS

In addition to Donate online facilities, people are more and more finding Standing Orders and Direct Debits from their bank accounts as helpful for arranging their finances.

Standing Orders can be used to support your parish and diocesan faith communities. There is a Standing Order form with this leaflet and it has your parish data already included. You just need to put in your bank account information and hand it in to your bank or to the parish.

If you use online banking, you can use this data to set up the Standing Order yourself online.

It could also be helpful if you might let your local parish know that you intend to use the Standing Order method of donation.

#### REBATE OF INCOME TAX

If an individual donates €250 or more to her or his parish in a year, that parish can claim a refund of tax paid on that donation at a specified rate, currently 31%.

In the case of a donation of €500, this equates

to an additional benefit through a tax refund of €224 at no additional cost to the individual and will bring the total value of the donation made to €724. Any payments made by standing order or through the online donate facility will also qualify.

For more information on how your parish might benedit from a tax refund to increase the value of your donation, please contact your local parish office.


